Ashley attended the North Carolina Governor's School in 2011, at Meredith College in Raleigh, North Carolina, as one of 600 top high school seniors from all over the state. She has been featured in the Shelby STAR newspaper in a series of articles, in news reports on local news outlets and also on the national level on CNN which has made her story an inspiration to millions. Ashley has been accepted into Harvard University and will attend in the fall of 2012. Ashley is an inspiring example of the desire to succeed under extraordinarily difficult situations and to give back. She will use donations that she has received to set up a non-profit organization "Uplift" for students "whose situations are worse than mine, and their futures are less certain. The only way to get out of poverty is through education."

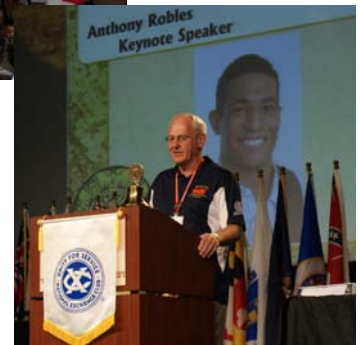


North Carolina District Goes Western!

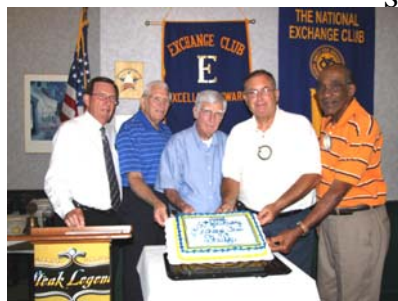
