**North Carolina Parent Aide Model Gains National Recognition**

"California Evidence-Based Clearinghouse for Child Welfare (CEBC) are pleased to announce that your program, Exchange Parent Aide Model, has been found to meet the criteria for inclusion."

This recognition by the California Evidence Based Clearinghouse is the direct result of the research that the NC Centers have been involved in for the last 8 years. I would like to thank all of the staff in the 5 sites that participated in this research - Forsyth, Stokes, Surry, Yadkin, Alamance and Iredell. It was very tough to do the extra data collection and to hold the model constant for the period of the research. Cynthia Napoleon-Hanger, Executive Director of the Forsyth County CAP Center, did a great job of providing the leadership of model and insuring consistency of data.

I have reported the results of the positive outcomes of this research to the NC Foundation Board often; and Cynthia and I have spoken around the country about the results. We have an article submitted to a journal on the results as well. One might think that once positive results are found from quality research that others, especially foundations and government, would accept your results as "evidence based"----- however, no such luck. CEBC is one of several national /international Clearinghouses that certifies that the research is legitimate. I spent quite a bit of time on the phone even in the midst of my summer vacation with CEBC discussing the results and how they were derived and what information I needed to send them to "prove" the results and other research efforts. This is the FIRST national peer acceptance of the fact that parent aides make a difference! - after over 30 years of operating the program - Whew!

How will this help? Foundations and State government pretty much expect that program be evidenced based if they are going to fund it. This has kept several states from around the nation from funding our Parent Aide model. In this state I have been able to assert the efficacy by showing the research, however, it will now make it easier to assert the quality of this program. I hope we will continue to have other Clearinghouses certify us. Programs around the country will immediately use this certification to apply for funding and it will help bring in \$100s of thousands of dollars to the parent aide effort to prevent child abuse.

This is a GREAT milestone. The NC Foundation has been key in supporting this effort over the many years - thank you.
