Receives Prestigious Donna Stone Award**

Durham, NC – (March 6, 2013) – Rachel Galanter, a family support program manager with The Exchange Clubs' Family Center in Durham, NC, was presented the Donna Stone Award by Prevent Child Abuse North Carolina (PCANC). The award recognizes an individual who has made significant contributions to supporting parents in their efforts to provide safe, stable, nurturing, and healthy environments for their children.

Galanter was recognized in front of 500 of her peers at the PCANC's Learning & Leadership Summit for her efforts to bring proven family strengthening strategies and programs to Durham, NC families.

"Everyone here at the Center is very proud of the work Rachel has done for the past 12 years, stated Margaret Zealy, Center Executive Director. "Rachel has been proactive in bringing evidence-based models of treatment to the family support program and is dedicated to empowering parents to create safe environments for their children. She is a leader in the child abuse prevention field and well deserving of this honor."

Galanter has led efforts to bring evidence-based family strengthening programs and strategies to Durham. She is dedicated to providing parents with concrete ways to improve parenting skills by ensuring professionals have access to best practice models and resources. She was instrumental in bringing The Incredible Years, Circle of Parents, and Strengthening Families programs to Durham. These evidence-based programs have been proven to increase parent-child interaction, improve family communication, and prevent child abuse and neglect before they occur.

The Donna Stone Award was established in 1986 to honor Donna J. Stone, founder of Prevent Child Abuse America. Recipients embody Stone's vision of utilizing community engagement, collaboration, and volunteerism to prevent child abuse and neglect.

*The Exchange Clubs' Family Center of Durham, NC, was established in 1992. The Center offers free evidence-based counseling services to Durham County residents in both English and Spanish. The Center has served more than 2,000 individuals this year and has gained recognition throughout the area community.*
