A.C.E. Stands for Accepting the Challenge of Excellence. This program recognizes high school students who have overcome great challenges in their circumstances during their high school years.

Alyssa has known many challenges as she is an example of someone who overcame physical limitations and had to adjust to a new environment. She was born in Thailand with Cerebral Palsy due to a premature birth and was abandoned. She went from using a walker to crutches to a wheelchair. And she learned how to navigate various school campuses. Alyssa was adopted from Thailand at the age of 6 and adjusted from having no parents to suddenly having parents, and having two Thai adopted siblings, and trying to learn a new language. In high school, Alyssa participated in various clubs. The Key club in the freshman year got her involved in the community. By the time she had finished her Junior year she had over 300 hours of community service. She joined Distributive Education Clubs of America, another activity she really enjoyed. She earned a proficiency in several categories at the NC State conference. Alyssa said her parents played a big part in her overcoming another obstacle to being independent and able to adapt. She was able to obtain a spot in the Academy of Information Technology.

Alyssa hopes after college to live independently in an urban area, while going into a career that benefits disabled people. She plans to utilize this in her marketing career as an efficient way to stay on top of her workload. She also would like to adopt a child of her own, to offer some child the same opportunity she had. -NC Awards Committee

Alannah attended the mission trips to Knoxville, Tennessee during the summers of 2013 and 2014. On the trips, she served the people of the poverty stricken town. The group was fortunate enough to hear triumphant accounts from war veterans now in senior living facilities as well as the stories of children coming from poor households. They were allowed to volunteer in the neighborhood soup kitchen and clean the beds that were used by the homeless neighbors surrounding the Church where they slept. It was inspiring to meet a deaf war veteran as they played bingo together during both summer trips. The group all had tears come to their eyes while visiting a senior mental hospital as the residents played Wii bowling or Monopoly and they saw their youthful spirits come alive. Each person, regardless of age, had a story to tell and each one was equally captivating. It gave her comfort to bring aid to those in need in such a well known city struck by such poverty. They sorted donated clothing at a thrift store and painted the walls of a Muslim refugee house. They all had great joy to hold hands and dance with those who constantly wondered where their next meal was coming. The group had a humbling experience, one that will be remembered the rest of their lives.

FAYETTEVILLE, NC (June 8, 2015)--Children who become victims of abuse and trauma will receive a special gift from the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office. **The Exchange Club of North Fayetteville** presented dozens of stuffed animals. to the Sheriff's office. The animals will be distributed to deputies to be used as comfort to child victims, a news release said. "This donation is another example of the commitment of the Exchange Club to make a difference in our community,"

Sheriff Earl "Moose" Butler said in the release. "The Exchange Club always works with us to prevent child abuse and to strengthen families and our community, and they work hard to help us when there is a breakdown in families and in the community." Butler said the gift of the stuffed animals is important.
